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## Leadership Team

Dear Parents and Carers,

The announcement of the lockdown came very suddenly on Thursday and, as you may be aware, many community members received the information through Minister Berry's media release before we received instructions.

Consequently, whilst I would like to give you as much information as possible today, please understand that some decisions have yet to be made.

Schools are working on two scenarios at the moment:

- the 'snap lockdown' of seven days, and
- a potential move to remote learning after this week.

### FOR THIS COMING WEEK : STUDENTS HOME FROM SCHOOL

Families should keep their children at home. The school will have a skeleton staff, remaining open for vulnerable children and for those children whose parents and carers cannot work from home. During this time we will provide supervision and some general learning activities. School staff will be spending this time preparing to move to remote learning, should the lockdown be extended, and will be expected to work from home to help keep the community and their own families safe.

If you wish for your children to undertake self-directed learning whilst at home this week there are two resources available to you.

If you cannot work from home and therefore need to send your child to school please take note of the following. Registration for student attendance this week is available at this link:

- Students should be dropped off at the Breezeway each morning prior to 9.10am (no earlier please).
- Students should be collected from the Breezeway no later than 3.15pm.
- All adults on the school grounds must sign in at the front office, check in using the CBRA Check-In App and wear masks. However we ask that parents and visitors only enter the school building by staff invitation.
- Although all students aged 12 and older are required to wear masks outside of the home, including at school, we have been advised that primary school students are exempt from this rule.
- The Griffith Preschool campus will **not be open** Monday to Thursday this week.

- Out of school hours care will remain open for children who need to attend, i.e. vulnerable children and children of those parents and carers who can't work from home. Please book places for your child if they will be attending school and you are unable to drop them off or collect them on time.
- The Paid Tutor program (Taekwondo, French, Chess etc.) is suspended for this week. No hire of school spaces other than for After School Care is permitted.
- All school playground equipment is unavailable for community use. **Families are welcome to use our bike track out of school hours though.**
- All excursions and special events have been postponed until we know more about an extended lockdown. If you have already paid for an excursion/incursion that cannot go ahead later on, we will refund the amount paid or hold it in credit.

### IN THE EVENT OF AN EXTENDED LOCKDOWN

I hope you can appreciate that I am not in a position to give you all of the details yet because firstly, the Ministers and Education Directorate may have to make decisions during the week, and secondly, because we were only able to start planning for this scenario on Friday. However I can give you some idea of what to expect if we are instructed to move to remote learning.

It is unlikely that the request for parents and carers to keep their children at home will change. All schools will most likely continue with a skeleton staff, remaining open for vulnerable children and for those children whose parents and carers cannot work from home. Students who attend school will continue their remote learning program under supervision, possibly in multi-age classrooms. A registration process will be set up for students who need to attend school, the details of which will be sent out prior to August 20<sup>th</sup>.

On Friday we spent time planning for remote learning. We will use many of the skills we learnt last year as well as reflections from staff, students and parents on what worked well and what we might do differently this time around. In the remote learning period you can expect the following approach that supports both synchronous (in real time) and asynchronous learning (in the students' own time).

- There will be at least one whole class and one small group synchronous session each day, using Google Meet/Hangout. (A school timetable will be developed for the whole class sessions and sent home to families prior to August 20<sup>th</sup>.)
- The individual check-ins that we used last year will be replaced by small group sessions in which students will receive instruction and support. At the end of each small group session parents of those children will be given a short period of time to ask questions related to their child's learning. Because the teachers will not be having 1:1 conversations with students without other students present, parents will not have to be present throughout (although you are very welcome).
- The online program will focus on the inquiry program, literacy and numeracy.
- In the daily whole class synchronous session the teachers will use the first 10-20 minutes to explain upcoming work, do a general well-being check, answer any burning questions and mark the roll. The second part will be a short lesson.

- The remote learning program will include:
  - a total of 45 minutes per day of both literacy and numeracy instruction (e.g. a face to face lesson or a five-minute instructional video on what is expected followed by set tasks).
  - 30 minutes of physical activities (e.g. a planned outdoor task, a ‘go noodle’ online dance video, or the practice of a fundamental motor skill) developed by the **specialist teachers**.
  - approximately 1.5 hours total over a week of asynchronous inquiry learning and other activities (the arts, languages), delivered by the classroom and/or specialist teachers
  - encouragement of reflective journal writing and drawing, play and discovery, and
  - learning intentions and clear success criteria.
- Students will be able to submit work online and will also be expected to record some of their learning in a dedicated book. Feedback will be provided as appropriate by teachers for work submitted online. At the end of the remote learning period we will also ask for all learning books to be returned to the school so that the teachers have evidence of learning that they can use for assessment and reporting purposes.
- Hard copy packs of learning will be available once a fortnight for families who prefer less online learning, especially for students in the junior years. These will be available online to print off at home but will also be available for collection from our front office for those of you who don’t have access to a printer.
- Parents and carers will be able to collect learning packs from the school at designated times before and during remote learning. These will include items such as a blank ‘learning book’, handwriting book etc.
- Parents and carers will also be able to collect reading materials from our library upon request and loan Chromebooks. Priority for Chromebooks will be for students in years 3 to six.

### **What can families do in preparation for remote learning?**

1. Stock up on pencils, pens, scissors and glue.
2. Let the school know now if you will need to borrow library books or a Chromebook.
3. Explore the school’s and Directorate’s Home Learning Resources websites.
4. Make sure you have signed permission for your child to use SeeSaw (all year levels) and Google Classroom (years 2-6).
5. **Make sure your child/you knows their log-in for Mathletics, Sora and the Digital Backpack. Email Nathan James ([Nathan.james@ed.act.edu.au](mailto:Nathan.james@ed.act.edu.au)) if you need any help with this.**

I know this is a difficult time for everyone. However we will get through it if we are thoughtful and kind to each other and work together as a community.

The groups are active performance ensembles and the families of students auditioning will need to be prepared to make a strong commitment to rehearsal and performance attendance for the year.
