Hello Red Hill Community,

It's wonderful to be back at Red Hill after a few months assisting another school. Please see below for an update on important events happening at school at the moment.

SunSmart Hats

The 1^{st of} August marked the return of 'Hats On' at school in our efforts to keep the children safe from the sun. Sun protection is recommended whenever UV levels reach 3 or higher which generally occurs from this time onwards in Canberra. After giving the students a one week grace period, we are now enforcing our 'play in the shade' rule for any student who does not have an appropriate hat. Each play area has a shaded area and students are being directed by duty teachers to play in the shade if they are not wearing a SunSmart hat. The Cancer Council recommends a broad-brimmed, legionnaire or bucket style hat which shades the face, nose, neck and ears, which are common sites for skin cancers. Caps and visors do not provide enough protection. SunSmart hats are available for purchase from our school uniform shop for those who have outgrown or misplaced their hat.

Note: It is important to label hats with your children's names so they can be returned to the owners when found. Spare hats are available for use at break times and can be found in a tub outside the uniform shop.

Book Week Events

To celebrate all things reading and books, we have several special events organised for the next couple of weeks. Book Fair kicks off on Monday in the library and runs for Weeks 5 and 6. This is an opportunity for families and students to purchase books. Ms. Naidoo has developed a schedule for classes to visit Book Fair and students can write a wish list during this visit. Families are also invited to browse Book Fair before and after school. More detailed information about this can be found later in the newsletter.

Book Week is 19-25 August (Week 6), and we will celebrate the week with our annual Book Week Parade, Walkathon and Grandparent Morning Tea on Friday 25 August. All families should have received correspondence from our P&C in Week 2 about the day. Please contact the Front Office if you require another copy of this note. Children are encouraged to dress up as their favourite character on Friday 25 August to participate in the Walkathon and Book Week Parade.

NAPLAN

We have received the 2023 NAPLAN results. These will be distributed to parents and carers of students in Years 3 and 5 early next week. Our teachers are taking a little time this week to review the results and contact parents if necessary. Those of you who have received NAPLAN results in previous years may notice that the format of reporting the results has changed. This is because Education ministers have agreed that NAPLAN test results will be reported using proficiency standards from this year. The proficiency standards represent a challenging but reasonable expectation of student achievement at the time of testing to deliver better information for teachers, parents and carers. Achievement in NAPLAN is now reported against proficiency levels instead of the previous numerical NAPLAN bands.

Students' results will show how they performed in each of the NAPLAN assessment areas against 4 new proficiency levels:

Exceeding: The student's result exceeds expectations at the time of testing.

Strong: The student's result meets challenging but reasonable expectations at the time of testing.

Developing: The student's result indicates that they are working towards expectations at the time of testing.

Needs additional support: The student's result indicates that they are not achieving the learning outcomes expected at the time of testing. They are likely to need additional support to progress satisfactorily.

National Science Week events - 12 - 20 August

National Science Week is ready to launch with a calendar full of events to inspire and excite curious minds of all ages. Visit local shopping centres to experience dinosaurs up close and personal, touch fossils and meteorites, try some chemistry experiments, learn about First Nations plants and tools, control a robot, or even touch a snake. ACT libraries are also running a range of engaging hands-on activities. Other events are scheduled across the ACT and more details can be found on the flyer below. Australia's annual science celebration, National Science Week is an opportunity to meet scientists, think big, and celebrate STEM. BOOK WEEK AUGUST 19th - 25th 2023


"Each year since 1945 the Children's Book Council of Australia has brought children and books together across Australia through Book Week.

As in the past we encourage students to be creative in putting together their costumes, rather than buying them. A prize will be awarded to the most creative costume for each year level.

Lost and Found



We have changed the way we process lost and found at the school.

During Covid parents were limited from attending the school so staff distributed items back to students.

Now with restrictions reduced we are returning to a system where students are primarily responsible for collecting lost and found from outside the uniform shop.

All lost and found will be placed in the big blue bin in the corridor outside the uniform shop. A few times a week this will be sorted and placed in the adjoining cupboards which are divided into named uniform items, unnamed uniform items, non-uniform clothing and in the final cupboard drink bottles, lunch boxes and other items. By sorting the items, we hope to make searching quicker and easier for the students. Parents are also welcome to look for an item there at drop-off or pick-up.

We are making this change partly because returning items took up a lot of staff time and also because having the students responsible for recovering items will hopefully encourage them to not lose them in the first place.

Ordering Online

It is a cashless online ordering system which streamlines payment, ordering and processing of purchases and events.

Quick and easy, it can be accessed 24/7 on PC, Mac or mobile app.

School Uniform orders for existing students will be delivered to your child's classroom. Otherwise, orders can be collected from the front office.

Ordering in person

Opening hours Wednesday 8.30 to 10:00am and Friday 2.30 to 4.00pm. We prefer payment by credit card, but we can accept cash.

With COVID continuing to present a risk we prefer that orders are made online where possible.

Secondhand requests can be emailed through to the shop manager.

Donations can be placed in the purple bin in the front office foyer.

Lost property collected around the school is placed in the big blue bin outside of the uniform shop.

Due to the amount of lost property and the shortage of staff, labeled items will no longer be returned to

classrooms.

Instead, the items in the blue bin will be sorted and then placed in the adjoining blue and white cupboards for students to look through and collect any of their property that they find."

Secondary Extension Ensembles – 2024

The ACT Instrumental Music Program is seeking students who will be in Years 7-12 in ACT public schools in 2024 to audition for secondary extension ensembles.

Current Year 6 students continuing to a public secondary school in 2024 can apply for:

- Junior Concert Band (Woodwind, Brass, Percussion): Years 7-8 students in ACT public schools in 2024
- Percussion Ensemble (Percussion Only): Years 7-12 students in ACT public schools in 2024
- Senior Concert Choir (Singers): Years 7-12 students in ACT public schools in 2024

Students auditioning for Junior Concert Band and Percussion Ensemble must have previous experience on their instruments. These groups are not suitable for beginners. Students auditioning for Senior Concert Choir may or may not have previous singing experience.

Auditions will be held online in Term 4 (30 October – 10 November).

All audition requirements and pieces will be available on the IMP website by the end of Term 3.

The ensembles are an excellent opportunity for hard-working, skilled and committed young musicians to work together in an enriching environment. The groups are active performance ensembles and the families of students auditioning will need to be prepared to make a strong commitment to rehearsal and performance attendance for the year.
