Please see below for an update on recent and upcoming events at our school.

#### Year 6 Camp

Congratulations to our Year 6 cohort on a wonderful camp this week. The teachers reported that the students demonstrated their leadership skills in a wide range of activities over the three days. We've been reliably informed that go-karting and learning to surf were highlights as was the Giant Swing, which had the most spectacular view of the Illawarra Escarpment and coastline (see image below). I'm sure everyone who attended has slept soundly in their own bed the last couple of nights.



#### SWIMMING CARNIVAL

Our school swimming carnival will take place on the Friday of week 6 at Dickson Aquatic Centre (for students turning 8 this year and older). Parent volunteers are very welcome. Permission and payment notes are due back by next **Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February (week 4)**.

#### **NAPLAN**

NAPLAN testing will occur in our school between **13 and 25 March 2024** for students in years 3 and 5. Nowadays the tests are online, and are tailored (or adaptive), which means that each one presents questions that may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses. This helps students remain engaged with the assessment. Tailored testing also allows a wider range of student abilities to be

assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway. (All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.)

NAPLAN provides valuable information to schools and parents about literacy and numeracy achievement. It supports school improvement processes by enabling teachers to monitor student progress and identify areas of strength and development. All eligible students are encouraged and supported to participate in NAPLAN testing. #### Bus Safety Week 2024: Safety never goes out of style!

"What's this coming along the road? It's a bus it's a bus... it's a school bus!" This week is Bus Safety Week 2024, and we are going back in time to 1989 with the original Bus Safe Rap because safety never goes out of style. Bus Safety Week is an opportunity to remind students of the importance of safe behaviours when on and around buses, bus stops and interchanges.

Brush up on your safety skills and see if you can do the Bus Safe Rap:

- > Signal the driver: Always signal the driver a safe distance from the curb by raising your arm and giving the driver plenty of notice.
- > Wait safely: Wait until the bus has left before you cross. Never walk in front of a bus, as other road users may not see you.
- > Respect bus stops: Bus stops and interchanges aren't playgrounds. Avoid running or playing ball games while waiting for a bus.
- > Stay alert: Put your phone away and turn the music down when moving around bus interchanges and crossing roads.

With several buses servicing our school, it's a timely reminder to showcase our commitment to safety as a community, from the bus stop to crossing the road and where we park our cars.

#### Vandalism

Last weekend we sadly experienced vandalism at the school which saw several windows smashed and some external furniture moved. ACT Police responded to the incident and are managing the follow up. 
## World Map

#### **Ordering Online**

The Red Hill School P&C Association uses Flexischools for uniform shop sales.

It is a cashless online ordering system which streamlines payment, ordering and processing of purchases and events. Quick and easy, it can be accessed 24/7 on PC, Mac or mobile app.

School uniform orders for existing students will be delivered to your child's classroom. Otherwise, orders can be collected from the front office.

#### Ordering in person

Opening hours Wednesday 8.30 to 10:00am and Friday 2.30 to 4.00pm. We prefer payment by credit card, but we can accept cash.

With COVID continuing to present a risk we prefer that orders are made online where possible.

Secondhand requests can be emailed through to the shop manager.

Donations can be placed in the purple bin in the front office foyer.








