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Leadership Team Overview



Dear Parents and Carers,

This morning our eight Rostrum finalists presented speeches to the school. The public speaking skills of these students were exceptional; they were articulate, thought provoking and entertaining. To be honest, even their counterparts, those who were not successful in reaching the school finals or who chose not to go further, were remarkable. When listening to some of the year six students' speeches last week I wondered which of them I will read about in the years to come because I am certain some will be responsible for significant positive change in the future. Not only were they courageous to speak in front of their peers and teachers, but they also demonstrated a deep level of thinking about the world around them, which they articulated clearly and passionately.

On a very different note, I need to clarify some confusion around the school canteen service. Since Covid 19 appeared, the school canteen has only been able to offer lunches, pre-ordered through Flexischools by 8am each day. This has been communicated in letters home, as well as newsletters. The lunches are delivered to classrooms during eating time by students in years 3 and 6. It has just been brought to my attention that the canteen provider had not removed the recess purchasing option on Flexischools, which has misled some families. Healthy Kids Association (HKA) will remedy this as soon as possible and apologise for causing confusion.

If parents wish to order recess for students in the junior school, they can still do so by ordering items to be delivered during the lunch eating break, which students can set aside for eating during the afternoon recess period. Senior students (4-6) can always access the bowl of fresh fruit in the staffroom if they need recess (or are feeling particularly ravenous during a growth spurt 0). If playing on the asphalt they can also purchase items across the counter between 10.30am and 10.45am.

Canteen counter sales are also now available Tuesday to Friday for the year levels playing on the asphalt each day (Junior school 11.25am-11.45am and 1.20pm-1.40pm). Not only does this add a little bit of excitement to the day for these students but it also provides them with the opportunity to develop financial literacy skills, calculating what they can afford to buy and how much change they are owed. It also gives the year six canteen leaders work experience serving their peers.

I wish to acknowledge the year three and year six students who deliver lunches and serve their peers every day. They are absolutely committed to their roles, turning up on time, rarely forgetting their allocated days and independently organising volunteers when rostered people are away.

Their roles are about more than just getting a necessary job done though. The IB Primary Years Program (PYP) framework encourages us to find varied opportunities for our young people to contribute to their community and take action.

The year six leadership program, of which canteen is just a part, works from a strength base and teaches our senior students that, whilst some leaders are elected, all of us have the capacity for leadership and responsibility

to use that capacity. Regardless of whether or not we are in formal leadership positions, all of us, by our actions, have the power to shape the world positively. All of us can contribute to peaceful living and wellbeing.

Everyone in the learning community has agency, see themselves as contributors to its strength and success, and take action to affect change (The Learning Community, IB, 2018).

Importantly, as well, the students' volunteer work in the canteen is underpinned by positive education principles. It is well established that the act of service to others improves well-being, both for the recipient and the giver. Giving and receiving have been shown to enhance life satisfaction, increase optimism, reduce anxiety and increase our sense of connectedness to others. One of our year six students actually gave a thoughtfully prepared speech about this recently, entitled "Paying it Forward", which I hope she will share with you in the next newsletter.
