Leadership Team Overview



Dear Parents and Carers,

It is important to provide the best possible learning environment for our students. We believe that education works best when families, schools and the community work together, sharing different knowledge, expertise and resources to support young people's learning and development.

There are several ways that we would like to initiate these partnerships with you in 2023.

THE LEARNING PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN HOME AND SCHOOL

QUESTIONNAIRES

We appreciate that each child is a complex, unique individual and that parents (caregivers) have an intimate understanding of their children. Today you will receive a student questionnaire. This is an optional invitation for you to share your understanding of your child. By providing this information you will greatly assist your child's teacher to get to know your child and to cater for his/her individual needs at school. We appreciate you taking the time to respond. All information is treated confidentially and only shared with staff on a 'need to know basis'. If, after filling out the questionnaire, you feel there are still issues you would like to discuss regarding your child, please ring the office to request an appointment with the class teacher. There will also be further opportunities for the sharing of information between teachers and parents at our Parent Information Night in week 4 (see below).

TERM 1 INFORMATION SESSIONS

Wednesday 15th February

Preschool: 5.30pm – 6 pm (online- link to follow through Seesaw and email)

As we have already held a preschool information session and conducted interviews with families, this session will be a little different to the K-6 arrangements. The teachers will provide a short presentation then open the floor to parents' questions. The Preschool sub-committee will also hold their annual AGM and seek parent nominations for 2023.

Wednesday 22nd February

- Kindergarten Year 3: 5.30-6.15pm "Teacher Meet and Greet" in classrooms
- 6.30pm-6.45pm Leadership Team Presentation in the Senior Hall
- ❖ Years 4-6: 7.00-7.45pm "Teacher Meet and Greet" in classrooms

At this evening helpful information will be shared with you about the school and curriculum. Parents and carers will also be able to meet the teachers and ask any 'burning' questions you may have about 2023.

SEESAW AND OTHER DIGITAL APPLICATIONS

Seesaw is a digital portfolio platform that we like to use to communicate with home about student learning. Each class has an account that parents and carers can sign up to so that they can see what is happening in their child's classroom.

Seesaw is student driven; therefore, each child's portfolio will look different from class to class and year to year. Students are given the opportunity to include items they are proud of, work that shows their achievement of an individual learning goal or a reflection of their learning to make connections. Teachers will also include posts about what the class is currently inquiring into and other parts of school life (e.g., excursions) to keep you connected to what's happening in the school.

As well as a way to help you engage with your child's learning, Seesaw will be used as one of the main communication tools for announcements and reminders. Teachers will make regular updates in conjunction with the newsletter, emails and hard copy notes.

All students will be given a note requesting parent/carer consent for a range of different applications and programs that may be used in the classroom over the course of the year, including Seesaw. Please make sure that you return this note as soon as possible. If you do not wish to use Seesaw, or have difficulty accessing the internet, please speak to your child's class teacher directly so that a different communication method can be negotiated.

We ask that, when you are viewing any items on Seesaw, you do not take screenshots or put any of the material onto other social media platforms to respect the privacy of all parties. We also ask that Seesaw is only used to communicate about learning. It is more appropriate that concerns be raised in person or through email with the class teacher.

QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS

Our staff are here to support students, parents and each other. If you have any questions or concerns, big or small, please do not hesitate to talk to your child's teacher. However, there may be times when the teacher is unable to help you, or you feel your question has not been answered. On those occasions, please come to see a member of the leadership team. We want to work in partnership with you and the sooner we are aware of a concern, the faster we can work together to find a solution.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Base 2023

All kindergarten students are required to participate in the BASE assessment process between Monday 13th February and Friday 24th February. This assessment takes place at the beginning and end of the school year to monitor student learning growth in kindergarten and identify students who may benefit from early academic intervention. The class teachers sit with the students during 1:1 online assessment and the interaction is a very positive one. However, a replacement teacher needs to take the class for a day while the assessments are being conducted. Some students can find this upsetting. Please help us to keep your children calm by reassuring them that their teacher will be back with them very soon. Please also make sure your child is at school on time during this assessment period.

Christian Education

The Christian Education Program is available at parent request. The sessions go for one hour during class time in week 9 each term. Permission notes will be sent home to all kindergarten students soon. If your child is in a higher year level a permission note can be collected at the front office.

Safety Before and After School

Students are often eager to connect with friends, arriving at school very early. Please remember that staff begin playground duty at 8.50am and that school commences at 9.10am. This is because staff need time before school to prepare for lessons and attend meetings. If you do need to drop your child off early, Woden Community Services provide 'before school care'. Please also remind your child that, if they arrive at school before duty

commences and experience any difficulty, they should come to the staffroom or the front office for assistance. Students should also be reminded to play in their designated year level area on the asphalt before school. Once they have entered the Breezeway or black gates they should remain in this area, rather than go to the basketball courts or local shops



After school each day, a teacher is on

duty at the front of the school until 3.45pm. It is important that all children wait for parents in this supervised space and that they are collected by 3.45pm so that the duty teachers can get to staff meetings and other commitments. If a child is not collected by 3.40pm the duty teacher will take him/her into the front office to wait and will ring his/her parents. The child will then need to be signed out by the parent when they arrive. Again, please remind your children that, if they experience any difficulty after school, they can go to the duty teacher or front office for assistance. Woden Community Services and the Paid Tutor Program also provide after school programs.

Thank you for sending your children to school with sun smart hats and water bottles.

We are looking forward to working with all students, families and staff in 2023.


