# Leadership Team Overview



Dear Parents and Carers,

This term is flying by quickly as we have just passed our halfway point. Well done again to our bands, choir and Wassa Wassa for their amazing evening performances, and also their follow up at our recent assembly. We acknowledge the generosity of 'Better Music' in their donations of instruments for the lucky door prizes. Excitingly, there has been much quality teaching and learning happening inside and outside our classrooms this term.

#### **PBL** and Positive Education

Positive behaviour for Learning (PBL) has been progressing this term. We have been working on a draft of behaviour expectation matrices for the shared spaces in the school.

The teachers were asked their views last term and identified areas in which they think we need to maintain a safe and positive environment. They aligned the expectations to our Positive Education framework. Recently, the senior students and the SRC had the opportunity to also go through the process. It was good to see the students recognising how similar the expectations are to our classroom essential agreements and how important it is that they have a voice. They took extra care in thinking about whether the matrix language would be understood by our junior students.



As part of the year 5 arts rotations, students have been involved in creating a design for the matrices which will be displayed around the school, hopefully early next year. Here is a template design from Aryahi Temurnikar.

PBL is about everyone working together to foster a safe and positive learning environment for all. It's essential for us to consult with the third pillar of our school community, you the parents. The Positive Education team would like to invite you to have input in the matrices and perhaps if you haven't already, get to know more about PBL in general. We are offering coffee and chat sessions for the following dates:

#### **Preschool and Kindergarten Orientation**

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be starting the orientation process for our newest 'Red Hillians' in our incoming preschool and kindergarten cohorts. Our 2023 pre-schoolers will spend some time getting to know their educators, other classmates as well as the usual routines. For our 2023 kindergarten students, the orientation visits will also be about getting to know a bigger school environment. Each current Red Hill preschool group will visit kindergarten for a session this week or next. Students who did not attend our Red Hill preschool programs will be invited to an orientation on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> January.

#### **P&C Cultural Integrity Activities**

Over the last few weekends, our P&C (thanks, Lara Hayes) have had Aaron from *Dreamtime Connections* come and run workshops on bush tucker and aboriginal culture. Students and parents were able to learn about native plants and their uses as well as have them in tea and



cookies. They learnt how to throw boomerangs that came back and how ochre is created (they were able to put some on their faces). To finish the



afternoon, they planted bush tucker in our Aboriginal gardens and enjoyed a BBQ with barramundi and kangaroo on the menu.

#### Year Three work with the Academy of Future Skills

On October the 26th, Year 3 travelled to the Academy of Future Skills laboratories in Chisolm to see if we could prove that understanding the properties of materials can help us to solve problems. In preparation for our excursion, Dan Heap and Melissa



Bissett from the Future Skills team came to Red Hill to show year 3 students how to conduct experiments to determine their properties and distinguish them from other similar substances. We checked for scent, determined if materials reacted to an acid, melted, or dissolved, measured their pH (acidity level) and determined if they conducted electricity. It turned out that the combination of properties that a material had was different, even if they looked alike!

When we arrived at the laboratory, we were presented with a crime scene - someone had gotten into the supplies and made a huge mess! Mysterious powders were scattered all over the lab and the suspects had particular combinations of substances that would help us to narrow in on the culprit. We gathered samples of the evidence left behind and conducted our experiments to determine that the mystery substances were sugar, baking soda, citric acid and laundry powder. Turns out it was Mrs Bissett after all! After we solved the crime, we had an opportunity to look at the powders through microscopes. Up close they actually look really different!



So, I guess it's true, by understanding the properties of materials we really can solve problems. I wonder what other world problems we can solve with our new scientific knowledge... Skye Eddi 3E

#### Year 5 Time Traveller's Convention

As part of the summative assessment for the unit of inquiry into 'Where we are in place and time', year 5 students hosted a Time Traveller's Convention. The convention took visiting year 4 students back in time to show how events have impacted nations across countries and the world.

"All of the year 5 classes made projects about a significant event in History. We presented it to Year 4. We had to bring the students back into the time of the event with representations. All the year 4 students came around

#### Leadership

Year 5 students are about to commence an inquiry into leadership in preparation for their role as leaders of the school as year 6 students. Students will work with the year 5 teachers, led by Ms Mel Newton, to complete workshops investigating what leadership can look like, what type of leader they may be and how they can lead students when demonstrating the PYP learner profile attributes, values and attitudes. By the end of the inquiry, the team aims for students to have a clear vision of leadership, a solid understanding of who they are as a leader and ideas for student leadership at Red Hill Primary School.


