Dear Parents and Carers,

This is such a busy but exciting term. Next Tuesday our Athletics Carnival will take place at Woden Park Athletics Field. Everyone is welcome to cheer on students – there will be a coffee cart and sausage sizzle fundraiser for our Smith Family sponsored student. Older students will also compete in a new discus event. Sunshine is forecast and we have at least ten parents and twenty Telopea students helping out as volunteers, so we are expecting a wonderful day.

Next Wednesday Year Five Band will attend a combined practice and the following day fifty year five and year six students will attend a Touch Football competition with Mr Colebatch. The following week we have two very special events. On Wednesday 12th and Thursday 13th two IB educators will visit our school to conduct our five yearly PYP evaluation. On Monday 10th twenty students and dignitaries will arrive from Kinmen in Taiwan. The students will spend a week in year five and year six classrooms, experiencing our education system and language, and sharing their own culture and language. This cultural study tour also provides our upper primary students with the opportunity to practise speaking in Mandarin for authentic purposes, and strengthen intercultural understanding.

NAPLAN YEAR 3 and YEAR 5

NAPLAN reports were sent home today. Please contact the office urgently if you do not receive your child's report by Tuesday next week. Furthermore, if you have any questions about your child's report, don't hesitate to contact the class teacher.

NAPLAN is a snapshot of where students are tracking at a given point in time. Please keep the following in mind.

- Because NAPLAN takes place in March it is a reflection of the learning that has taken place in previous years and so may differ from the end of semester reports that came home in early July.
- Every child comes to school with different experiences and emotions - some students flourish in this style of assessment task and others find it challenging. We encourage students to simply do their best but some approach the task with gusto and others are quite nervous.
- NAPLAN is one piece of information about a child's learning. Teachers use it alongside everyday classroom work and other assessments to understand a child's progress and plan next steps.
- NAPLAN is very helpful for schools to reflect on the effectiveness of programs.

THANK YOU!!!

One of our Friday afternoon RHIPP activities is tennis. I would like to give two ‘shout outs’- firstly to Matt McDonald who provided free coaching last term and is generously lending the school his tennis equipment this term. The Red Hill Tennis Club has also provided us with courts at a subsidised rate. If you have any connection with the Red Hill Tennis Club or Matt’s tennis school please convey our thanks.

I would also like to thank the Brumbies who provided four rugby union clinics for students in years three and four recently through the Sporting Schools Program. Although a grant covered most of the cost the Brumbies subsidised the clinics. Both students and teachers benefited from exposure to new ball skill drills.

Sun Smart Policy

All students are now required to wear SunSmart hats again when outdoors. We recently reviewed our Sun Protection Policy in light of recommendations from Cancer Council ACT and ACT Education. The policy will be presented at the next Board meeting and, once ratified, will be uploaded to the school website. The most significant amendment is that hats are now recommended, even in June and July, when students or staff are outdoors for extended periods of time.

Traditionally we would celebrate Book Week on Friday 28th August. Because the year two water safety program would clash with our special Book Week events we will celebrate on **Friday September 4th** instead this year.

On September 4th our famous annual Book Week Parade and fundraiser will take place alongside the P&C’s equally famous Grandparent’s Morning Tea.

Mrs Naidoo and teachers have already started sharing the Book Council’s shortlisted books with students. We will culminate our celebration of rich literature by dressing up as book characters for the parade. As in the past we encourage everyone to be creative in putting together their costumes, rather than buying them. A prize will be

awarded to the most creative costume using recycled materials for each year level. Prizes will also be awarded to the most enthusiastic fundraisers.

Important Updates

Changes to bus services from term 3

- From Monday 20 July 2026, changes to the bus network began across Canberra. These changes will help make bus services more reliable for students and other passengers.
- Changes include the return of Rapid 2 and Rapid 3 services to west Belconnen, more frequent Rapid 4, Rapid 5 and Rapid 6 services, and updates to some school bus timetables.
- This means that temporary local services route 12 and route 13 will cease service.
- The timetable changes are designed to improve service reliability and better support students travelling to and from school.
- These improvements have been made following ongoing monitoring of traffic conditions around the Commonwealth Avenue Bridge Renewal project. Improved traffic conditions mean buses can travel more reliably across the bridge.
