LEADING UP TO CHRISTMAS

Our school community is diverse, and families celebrate many different events over the school year. In December many of our students begin celebrating Christmas and like to give classmates cards and other gifts. In particular we ask that candy canes are not sent to school. Not only are they a red food, but they increase plastic litter, are particularly bad for dental health and often become a safety issue when children are running around.

SCHOOL BOARD

School-based management and decision making is a longstanding and well-embedded philosophy in the ACT public education system, having been an underpinning principle of school management since 1976.

School boards work in partnership with the Principal and school community. They have specific responsibility for endorsing and overseeing the strategic direction and priorities of the school; monitoring and reviewing school performance; developing, maintaining and reviewing curriculum; and approving budgets and policies for the effective use of school resources.

We will have two parent positions and a staff position vacant on our School Board from March 30th, 2024. Being a Board member offers the opportunity to see school life from a different perspective and we encourage you to consider nominating. Nominations and elections will take place early in term one.

Ordering Online

The Red Hill School P&C Association uses Flexischools for uniform shop sales.

https://www.flexischools.com.au/

It is a cashless online ordering system which streamlines payment, ordering and processing of purchases and events. Quick and easy, it can be accessed 24/7 on PC, Mac or mobile app.

School uniform orders for existing students will be delivered to your child's classroom. Otherwise, orders can be collected from the front office.

Ordering in person

Opening hours Wednesday 8.30 to 10:00am and Friday 2.30 to 4.00pm. We prefer payment by credit card, but we can accept cash.

With COVID continuing to present a risk we prefer that orders are made online where possible.

Secondhand requests can be emailed through to the shop manager.

Donations can be placed in the purple bin in the front office foyer.

Lost property collected around the school is placed in the big blue bin outside of the uniform shop.

Due to the amount of lost property and the shortage of staff, labeled items will no longer be returned to classrooms. Instead, the items in the blue bin will be sorted and then placed in the adjoining blue and white cupboards for students to look through and collect any of their property that they find."



Uniform Shop Extended Hours 2024

The uniform shop is open for extended hours early each year to cater for increased demand in this period.

We will open in the week before schools restarts with the hours shown below.

Please note that new students start school on Tuesday 30 January 2024. Continuing students return to school on Wednesday 31 January 2024. Friday the 26th of January is a public holiday.

Current opening hours (Wednesday 8:30am to 10:00am and Friday 2:30pm to 4:00pm) will not change for the duration of term four in 2023 but Flexischool orders after the 6th of December will not be available until the shop reopens in 2024.

The shop will be setup in the grade four corridor prior to the resumption of classes on the 31st of January.






Rapid Antigen Tests within ACT public schools
