Dear Parents and Carers,

At last week's whole school assembly there was great excitement at the announcement that two traditions have been reinstated. The first was the return of the "Golden Gnome", which was proudly wrapped in a blue scarf by the La Perouse house leaders. For those of you who have not heard mention of this tradition, the Golden Gnome (which has sat without purpose on the front office counter for a while) used to visit assembly regularly to be wrapped in the scarf of the house which had earned the most points. His reappearance at assembly last Friday was received with applause from the students.

House points are earned by students for participation in events such as the sports carnivals, as well as in class and on the playground through demonstration of the attributes of the Learner Profile or one of the attitudes that underpin these attributes e.g., supporting a classmate who is experiencing a challenge, showing kindness to a younger student, working cooperatively with peers, persevering with a personally challenging task. Students can also earn house points by receiving a gold token when they demonstrate a specific targeted behaviour. At present



we are focusing on respect for self, others and the school environment.

RED HILL INTERESTS, PURSUITS AND PURPOSE PROGRAM (RHIPP)

The second announcement that received an enthusiastic round of applause on Friday was in regard RHIPP. RHIPP is a whole school program underpinned by relational and positive education principles, designed to enrich young people's holistic development.

Some of the intentions of the RHIPP program are to:

- promote physical and emotional wellbeing by exposing students to potential interests and hobbies that they can pursue outside school and later in life,
- encourage students to be balanced, open-minded and willing to explore new experiences,

- create a sense of belonging and connectedness by fostering cross-age relationships between adults and students of different ages,
- help young people and adults develop a sense of purpose by providing service and giving to others (older students leading activities and mentoring younger students, wider community engagement such as outreach singing), and
- provide an avenue for children and adults to pursue areas of interest and explore personal strengths and individual learning styles.

Students from all ages will attend a wide range of activities delivered by teachers, volunteers and year six students on Friday afternoons. Experiences include bike riding, chess, gardening, cooking, sewing, sport, Origami, water colour painting, African Dance, gym, community service, Lego... The list is endless really. Students will be encouraged to try a mixture of new things, things that they love doing and things that give pleasure to others.

PLAYPOD: CALLING FOR RECYCLED MATERIALS

We would really appreciate donations of recycled materials, especially old clothes, shawls, scarves, large pieces of material, foam pieces, old bike tyres, cardboard tubes, etc. The materials will be used for our junior school Play Pod, which provides resources for younger students to play with during recess and lunch. It is not structured play but an opportunity for students to use objects to inspire their own creative play. Play Pod is based under the tree near the bike racks and the resources are stored in a room beside 'junior after school care'.

In closing, I would like to welcome back Dave Corcoran, who has been assisting another school for the last few months. Although they don't attend Red Hill School, I would also like to send a big 'thank you' to the twenty-four senior students from Telopea School who volunteered at our athletics carnival last week. They were fantastic helpers and wonderful role models.

We have changied the way we process lost and found at the school.

During Covid parents were limited from attending the school so staff distributed items back to students.

Now with restrictions reduced we are returning to a system where students are primarily responsible for collecting lost and found from outside the uniform shop.

All lost and found will be placed in the big blue bin in the corridor outside the uniform shop. A few times a week this will be sorted and placed in the adjoining cupboards which are divided into named uniform items, unnamed uniform items, non-uniform clothing and in the final cupboard drink bottles, lunch boxes and other items. By sorting the items, we hope to make searching quicker and easier for the students. Parents are also welcome to look for an item there at drop-off or pick-up.

We are making this change partly because returning items took up a lot of staff time and also because having the students responsible for recovering items will hopefully encourage them to not lose them in the first place.
